





# MAIN SPONSORS



Understanding how people think about faith in our communities is the first step towards building bridges with them. Working with polling experts YouGov, Bible Society commissioned a survey to ask almost 20,000 people about their attitudes towards Christianity, faith and the Bible. As they mapped the spiritual ground in England and Wales, they identified eight distinct spiritual types or personas, ranging from 'Bible loving' at one end to 'Bible dismissive' at the other – with a complex range of attitudes in between. The results of this huge survey are available on a digital platform called Lumino. Here you can discover both the national picture, and what your local community is saying about these key topics. In sub-Saharan Africa, nine out of ten people are living without access to safe surgery. Many are in pain and suffer needlessly from conditions such as curable blindness, suffocating facial tumours, cleft-lips, bowed legs and constrictive burn scars. Lack of medical help turns these treatable conditions into diseases that cause misery and kill. Mercy Ships follows the model of Jesus, bringing hope and healing to the world's poor. They operate the world's largest charity hospital ship to help the church provide free surgery. These life-changing surgeries are made possible by a diverse crew of volunteers, serving in over 200 roles, from mechanics and teachers to plumbers and chefs. Mercy Ships also train local surgeons and renovate local operating theatres, so after the ship leaves, hope and healing remains.
